

## KINDERGARTEN LEARNER OUTCOMES

Kindergarten students will demonstrate the ability to:

...develop a growing appreciation for reading

...write and identify consonant and short vowel letter sounds

...Identify words in print, (pointing out the start and the ending of a sentence)

...realize that reading and writing have a left and right progression

...communicate effectively through drawing, writing, speaking, and listening

...Comprehend what is heard, spoken, or viewed

...Identify various shapes and number patterns

...compare, order, and sort objects

...Compare groups of more, less, and equal value

...write, place in order, count, and recognize numbers up to 30

...Explore addition and subtraction to six

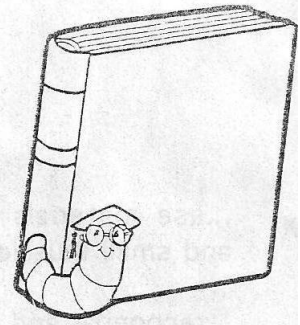
...use critical and creative thinking to interpret data and solve problems

...Develop work habits that will enhance their schooling (i.e. listen and follow directions, work without disrupting others, work cooperatively with others by taking turns)

...Discover, identify, and become curious about components in their environment in the areas of science, health, math, reading, writing, and social studies

...Identify and describe various kinds of change in their environment

...work independently and in groups using appropriate behaviors



...use materials and participate in activities which will strengthen large and small muscles and develop eye-hand coordination

...recognize and deal with their own feelings and the feelings of others in the appropriate manner

...Identify the importance of self-worth in themselves and others

...begin to identify their own special interests and abilities

...describe appropriate behaviors which help lead to becoming healthy, happy, and well adjusted individuals
